'Disciplines, Indisciplines and Interdisciplinarity' **Professor Steven Connor, Director of CRASSH, Cambridge**

Charting the rise over the last 50 or so years of different kinds of interdisciplinarity, Steven Connor will reflect on the forms that interdisciplinarity can take in the arts and humanities and the kinds of value they can have.

Steven Connor is Grace 2 Professor of English in the University of Cambridge and Director of Cambridge's Centre for Research in Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities (CRASSH). CRASSH's mission is to create new resources for thought, stimulate interdisciplinary research and disciplinary innovation, establish new intellectual networks and affiliations, respond to emerging social and political challenges, engage new publics in humanities research and help to shape public policy.

Steven has published on many topics, including Dickens, Beckett, Joyce, value, ventriloquism, skin, flies and air. His most recent books are *Living by Numbers: In Defence of Quantity* (2016), *Dream Machines* (2017), *The Madness of Knowledge: On Wisdom, Ignorance and Fantasies of Knowing* (2019) and *Giving Way: Thoughts on Unappreciated Dispositions* (2019). He has two books forthcoming: *A History of Asking: The Force of Petition* (2021) and *Styles of Seriousness* (2022).
