Research Careers 101 Panel

Prof Benjamin Thompson

Associate Professor of Medieval History and OOC DTP Associate Director (for Oxford), Benjamin Thompson is a medieval historian who specialises in the role of the church in society and politics between the Norman Conquest and the Reformation in England.

Prof Ine Jacobs

Ine Jacobs is the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Associate Professor of Byzantine Archaeology and Visual Culture, and Oxford's representative on the OOC DTP Training and Development Group. She is a late antique archaeologist researching the development of the Mediterranean between the fourth and the seventh centuries.

Dr Mary Cox

Mary Cox is a British Academy Postdoctoral Fellow and William Golding Junior Research Fellow in the Arts, Humanities, & Social Sciences. Her research examines the effects of war on the living standards of non-combatants. Her new book *Hunger in War & Peace: Women and Children in Germany, 1914 - 1924* was recently published by Oxford University Press.

Dr Ros Holmes

Ros Holmes is Presidential Academic Fellow in the History of Chinese Art at the University of Manchester. Before taking up this role she was a Departmental Lecturer and Junior Research Fellow at Oxford, where she completed her DPhil. Her research focuses on the art of twentieth century and contemporary China with a special interest in online visual culture. She is currently completing her first book, provisionally entitled *The Art of Incivility in Contemporary China*.

Dr Rebecca Ehata

Rebecca Ehata is a Careers Adviser with particular responsibility for advising Research Staff. Her own research background is in human rights, international politics and migration.
